January 26th 1909

The Council met in accordance and pursuant to Statutes
All members having filed their certificate of election the Clerk called the Council to order and requested them to elect a Warden for the ensuing year
The Clerk appointed Councillors Moore and Simpson as scrutineers
The Clerk then declared the nomination for Warden for the year 1909 now open
Moved by Mr. J. H. Mitchell and seconded by Mr. Joseph Caldwell
That Mr. Richard Bell Reeve Esq. be Warden of the County of Simcoe for the year 1909

After waiting 15 minutes the Clerk declared the nominations closed and there being no other nomination the Clerk declared Mr. Richard Bell Reeve of Essex duly elected Warden of the County of Simcoe for the year 1909

The Council reassembled at 3 o'clock when His Honour Judge Ardagh held a special Court and administered the declaration of office to the Warden elect.

His Honour addressed the Council in his usual eloquent manner particularly referring to the work and duties of the Municipal Clerks and the unequal manner in which the Municipalities of the County are assessed and strongly recommended that all assessments be made according to the assessment Act. He feelingly referred to the retirement of His Honour Judge Byrns after his long and faithful service of 25 years to the County of Simcoe.

The Warden then took the chair and stated that he would defer his inaugural address until the evening session.

Ex Wardens D. C. Bave and R. H. Jupp being present in the Chamber they were requested to take seats beside the Warden.
