Evening Session

The Council met according to adjournment

His Honour Judge Wismer held a special Court and administered the declaration of Office to the Warden elect

Judge Wismer then addressed the Council expressing regret that His Honour Judge Strachan who so often officiated in this capacity was unable to do so on this occasion through ill health. He considered the position of Warden one of high honor and of great importance particularly so in the County of Simons which we are all proud to know is one of the largest and most prosperous Counties in the Province and the Council thereof is as large and influential a body as some of our Legislatures in the Western Provinces. He expressed a wish that the Council would have a successful and prosperous year

The Warden then took the Chair

Moved by Mr. Brown and seconded by Mr. M. E. Eversham and ordered that this Council tender to His Honour Judge Wismer a vote of thanks for his attendance here this evening to swear in the Warden elect and wish to extend to him our thanks for his able and instructive address

His Honour Judge Wismer thanked the Council for their vote of thanks and stated that he considered it a pleasure to meet and associate with so influential a body of men

Ex Wardens Murphy and Gardin being in the Council the Warden requested them to take seats on the dais

The Warden addressed the Council thanking them for the high honour they had conferred upon him by electing him Warden of the County of Simons one of the largest and most prosperous Counties in the Province of Ontario. He urgently requested them to follow up their past record in the dispatch of the business brought before them. He was sorry to say that the finances of the County were not in as good a condition as he would like to see them but this was due to certain sums having been expended for which no provision had been made in the estimates of last year and also to the fact that this Council did not receive the \$2000 from the Ontario Legislature on account of expenditure on the Holland River Bridge re Good Roads account which they had expected to receive however he expected with the exercise of close economy they would be able to get over the difficulty without any serious burden to the ratepayer
