

Council Chamber Orillia

June 19 1922

The Council met in the Council Chamber of the Town of Orillia as per adjournment at the January Session

The Warden in the Chair

The Clerk informed the Council that John Mac's Reeve of Collingwood had resigned his seat on the Collingwood Council Board and that Mr Wm Carmichael was duly elected Reeve of the Town of Collingwood and that his certificate was filed.

The Warden requested Mayor Sudhope of Orillia C.H. Hale of Orillia, H.S. Ruby Ex-Councillor take their seats on the dais

Mayor Sudhope addressed the Council thanking the members for having accepted the invitation of the Town of Orillia in holding their June Session in the Town of Orillia and assured them of a hearty welcome not only by the members of the Council but by the citizens of Orillia in general. He invited the Council to view the Power system at the Ragged Rapids also the Soldiers Memorial Hospital and other Institutions. He also invited the Council to a Luncheon at the Orchard Beach Inn.

The Warden thanked Mayor Sudhope for his kindly welcome and assured him that the Council appreciated the manner in which they were treated by the Council of the Town of Orillia and looked forward to a pleasant and profitable session.

Mr C.H. Hale Chairman of the Power and Light Commission endorsed the words spoken by Mayor Sudhope.

Ex-Councillor H.S. Ruby addressed the Council in a short and humorous speech.

The Warden addressed the Council congratulating the members on their all being

able to be present. He desired to thank the Council and citizens of the Town of Orillia for their kind reception and kind invitation to view the Power & Light Works and other Institutions of the Town. He also desired to thank the Ladies of Westborough for the beautiful bouquet of flowers which they had presented to him and he did not forget the young lad who had presented him with a button hole bouquet. He referred to the loss the Council had sustained in the decease of W.A.J. Bell late County Solicitor a man of sound judgment and a lovable disposition. He stated that on the decease of Mr. Bell he called the Chairman of the several Committees together and stated that they had appointed W.A. Boys Esq. M.P. County Solicitor pro tem and also at the same time they had recommended a rate of wages to be paid on the County Road System in accordance with a request from the Government. He referred to the smallness of the appropriation on the County Road System which hardly seemed adequate to keep up in proper state of repair the large amount of miles now under the County Road System, but he was very loth to increase the County rate as many of the Municipalities had fixed their rate anticipating that the County rate would not be increased. He was satisfied that the Council would use their usual judgment with economy but at the same time with efficiency.
