The Clerk called the Members to order and requested them to elect one of their number to be Warden for the current year.

The Clerk asked Councillors Carlton and Dutton to act as scrutineers and declared the nominations open for the position of Warden for the year 1937.

Moved by Councillor Dutton, seconded by Councillor Robb, and ordered,

That George Patterson, Reeve of the village of Port McNicoll, be Warden of the County of Simcoe for the year 1937.

Moved by Councillor Barker, seconded by Councillor Fleming, and ordered,

That Albert Toner, Reeve of the township of Flos, be Warden of the County of Simcoe for the year 1937.

Moved by Councillor Borrow, seconded by Councillor Tessier, and ordered,

That C. D. Stewart, Reeve of the town of Barrie, be Warden of the County of Simcoe for the year 1937.

Moved by Councillor Kiernan, seconded by Councillor Stevens, and ordered,

That W. J. Cunningham, Reeve of the town of Alliston, be Warden of the County of Simcoe for the year 1937.

The Clerk, having waited for fifteen Minutes, declared the nominations closed.
Councillors Kiernan and Cunningham, with the consent of their mover and
seconded, having withdrawn, the Clerk proceeded to take the vote with Councillors Patterson,
Toner, Stewart, and Evans as candidates. No candidate having received a majority of the
votes of the members present the Clerk declared no election, and according to the rules
Councillor Toner having received the lowest number of votes, his name was dropped. The
Clerk proceeded again to take the vote with Councillors Patterson, Stewart, and Evans as
candidates, and no candidate having received a majority of the votes of the members present
the Clerk declared no election, and Councillor Patterson having received the lowest number
of votes, his name was dropped. The Clerk proceeded again to take the vote with Councillors
Stewart and Evans as candidates, and Councillor Stewart receiving a majority of the votes
of the members present, the Clerk declared him duly elected Warden for the year 1937.

His Honor Judge Holmes, held special court to administer the declaration of
office to the Warden elect. His Honor stated he approved of the method of electing the
Warden as practiced in the County of Simcoe. In other Counties where he had been, the same
seriousness and dignity were not observed. On other occasions where he had performed a
similar duty in the County, his previous acquaintance with the elected Warden had been
limited, but in the present instance he was well acquainted with Warden Stewart and knew
him as a young man of ability and a gentleman and he wished both him and the Council a
successful year.

The Warden then took the chair.

Warden Stewart addressed the Council and thanked the members for the honor
they had conferred on him and trusted that no action of his would cause them to think their
confidence had been misplaced.

He referred to some of the problems the Council would have to deal with,
among them was the one of Finance and the question of Midland and Pentanguishene's debentures.

The Ontario Legislature had seen fit to relieve the County from any part
of the payment of Mothers' Allowance and Old Age Pensions. In this County it would amount
to over \$90,000.00 and should enable the County to reduce the large bank overdraft and permit
of its being paid off in a few years.

He recommended that when possible that all members sit in at the meetings
of the Finance Committee so they would become the more familiar with the finances and general
business of the County.

He requested the Chairmen of the different standing committees to be prompt
and on time when the Committees were called and asked the members to be regular in attendance
at the meetings of the Committees and sessions of the Council.

He asked for the co-operation of the members throughout the year.

Rev. Dr. Shortt, representing the Ministerial Association of the Town of
Barrie, addressed the Council and congratulated the Warden on his election. He stated that
he with Rev. W. K. Batty represented not only the Ministerial Association of the Town of
Barrie, but all the Ministers of the County, thereby recognizing the relationship of the
temporal with the spiritual. He said there were spiritual duties in all things and there was
a great responsibility on the members in all their activities.

There was a great deal of restlessness in the world but he found in Canada
a few years ago, when he had occasion to travel across it, an amount of evenness and the
members of the Council had a great opportunity to promote a spirit of stability and establish
a feeling of confidence.

The Rev. W. K. Batty, also representing the Ministerial Association of the
Town of Barrie, offered prayer.

Moved by Councillor Coombs, seconded by Councillor Brawley, and ordered,

That a hearty vote of thanks be tendered his Worship Judge Holmes for his
services in administering the oath of office to the Warden elect, and for his interesting
and instructive remarks. Also to the Ministerial Association for their services through
their representatives, Rev. Dr. Shortt, and Rev. Batty, in connection with the opening of
Simcoe County Council for the year 1937.

The Warden having duties which called him from the Council Chamber, asked
to be excused by the Members and appointed Councillor Carlton to preside for him in his absence.

Robertson
Mayor ~~Grigg~~ of Barrie and Ex-Warden Drinkwater, being in the Chamber, were
invited to seats on the dias.

Mr. Lawley, representing the Canadian National Institute for the Blind, addressed
the Council and stated in 1934 the Council gave a grant of \$150.00 and the same in
1935.

The number of blind being looked after in the County had been reduced but the
cost of caring for those still in need was not reduced.

He was glad to know their Institution had the confidence of the Council and
people in the County.

Mr. Harold Webb had been appointed Assistant Field Secretary in the County and was very competent to give assistance.

The speech from the Throne at the opening of the Dominion Parliament forecasted pensions for the blind at a younger age than seventy, which was the requirements for Old Age Pensions. This would be a great assistance as most of the people who were blind became so after middle life.

The acting Warden assured Mr. Lawley that his request would receive earnest consideration by the Council.

Mayor Robertson thanked the Council for electing Reeve Stewart as Warden for 1937 and bespoke loyal support for all the members of the Council during the year.

He stated that the Council was fortunate in having Reeve Stewart as Warden but it might be to the disadvantage of Barrie on account of him having to devote a lot of his time to the County's business.

He trusted administrators would in future so legislate that we would never again have such a severe depression as that through which we were emerging.

Ex-Warden Drinkwater addressed the Council and remarked on his changed position in not now presiding over the deliberations of the Council.

He asked the members to give their best attention to the business of the County and to endeavor to get rid of the present large bank overdraft.

The fact that the Ontario Legislature was assuming the full cost of Mothers' Allowance and Old Age Pension would assist towards clearing off the overdraft. He did not approve of lowering the County rate at the present time.

Councillor Carlton explained that he was almost the only member from the south part of the County to vote for Reeve Stewart for Warden. He had watched Reeve Stewart since he was a member of the Council and saw that he had ability and thought this was a young man's age, he voted for him accordingly.
