MINUTES

Of the November Session, 1940, of the Municipal Council
Of the County of Simcoe

FIRST DAY

Council Chamber, Barrie,
November 25th, 1940.

The Council met pursuant to the call of the Warden.

The Warden in the Chair.

All the members of the Council were present.

The Minutes of the last meeting of the Council having been printed and distributed were taken as read.

The Warden addressed the Council and welcomed them to the final Session of the year.

He referred to the illness of Councillor Toner and was very glad to see that he had recovered and was in his usual place in the Council.

He referred to the loss the County and the Province had sustained since the June Session in the person of the Hon. Dr. Simpson, Minister of Education since 1934, and the representative of Centre Simcoe since 1929. He was very popular and his early death is much to be regretted.

The season of 1940 would go into history as being most unusual on account of the unprecedented rainfall during the summer which made it extremely difficult to plant and harvest the season's crops.

The war situation did not appear any worse than at the June Session and in fact, in his opinion, the situation was improved but the members were well informed of conditions through the press and over the radio.

The report of the Sirois Commission on Dominion and Provincial relations, which was presented to the Dominion Parliament last May, will be considered at a conference in Ottawa on Jan. 14th, 1941, by representatives of the Dominion and the Provinces. The members of the Council might give this matter their consideration during the session and perhaps send a recommendation to the Conference.

From F. L. Weldon, Clerk of Victoria County, re cost of marking
Entrance Examination papers.

Mr. R. W. McVittie, Public School Inspector for North Simcoe, appeared before the Council and suggested that something be done to encourage the adoption of a system of purchasing war savings certificates by the pupils of the rural public schools. He stated that the Kiwanis Club of Barrie and the Town Council was attaching the first and last war stamp on a war savings certificate for each pupil attending public school in Barrie.

He suggested that something similar might be done by the County for each rural school pupil and as there were about 6,400 rural school children a war certificate for each would amount to about \$25,000.00 and would cost the County about \$3,200.00. He afterwards explained that if this suggestion were adopted the amount would be levied on the County generally, including the Towns, and said it might be taken up by the Townships individually.

The Warden assured him that his suggestion would be carefully considered by the Council.

Councillor Luck reported on the inquiry of Councillor Drinkwater as to the amount of money spent on County Road No. 18 in Orillia township. The amount spent was \$1,765.00. *to the present date!*





Spraying with chemicals	180 miles	costing \$17.50 per mile.
Cutting shoulder weeds with power mower	125 miles	costing 1.31 per mile.
Cutting by hand and team mowers	40 miles	costing 7.50 per mile.

There were 40 miles of road on which nothing was done to kill weeds. These sections were sprayed in previous years. Lack of available labour made it necessary to neglect these 40 miles entirely.

Ammonium sulphate	2.28 per 100 lb. bag.

½ lb. chlorate }
½ lb. sulphate } for ordinary weeds.

A road for trucking was constructed to the Elevator at a cost of \$15,000.00. This will result in extra business to the Elevator of between 400,000 and 500,000 bushels of grain.
